declared and contained concerning the trust property or other hereditaments which shall be so given in exchange as aforesaid or as near thereto as the nature of the hereditaments to be taken in exchange and other circumstances will admit.

11. It shall be lawful for the Trustees or any three or more of them nominated for the purpose by the Committee to execute and to accept transfers of stock and other securities and property and to hold and dispose of the same and the income thereof (with power to vary investments) for any purpose or purposes of the Institute as the Committee may direct.

12. If the members of the Institute for the time being shall at any time hereafter by a two thirds majority of those present and voting by ballot at a General Meeting duly and specially convened for the purpose resolve that the Institute is no longer required, or that for want of adequate support or otherwise it cannot effectively be kept up or that for any other reason it will be desirable to sell or convert any hereditaments and property subject to the trusts hereof and apply the money to arise from the sale or conversion thereof to some other purpose or purposes then it shall be lawful for the Trustees

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by the direction of the Committee as aforesaid either to hold or to sell and convert any such hereditaments and property or any part or parts thereof and to stand possessed of any such hereditaments and property or any part or parts thereof or the net money to arise from such sale or conversion In trust for all or such one or more exclusively of other or others of Institutions in the said Parish of Newton Terrors or for such other purposes for the benefit of the Inhabitants of that Parish as the Committee may in like manner decide and in default of agreement Upon trust as the Parochial Church Council of the said Parish of Newton Terrors shall by writing under their hands decide.

13. The provisions with reference to the appointment of new Trustees contained in the Trustee Act 1893 shall apply to these presents and the power of appointing new Trustees hereof shall be exercisable by the persons and in the manner therein mentioned except that if and whenever the number of Trustees hereof shall be reduced to less than three the power of appointing new Trustees shall be exercised and the Trust filled up and that no one shall be appointed a Trustee unless he or she shall first
